Connect the Stars

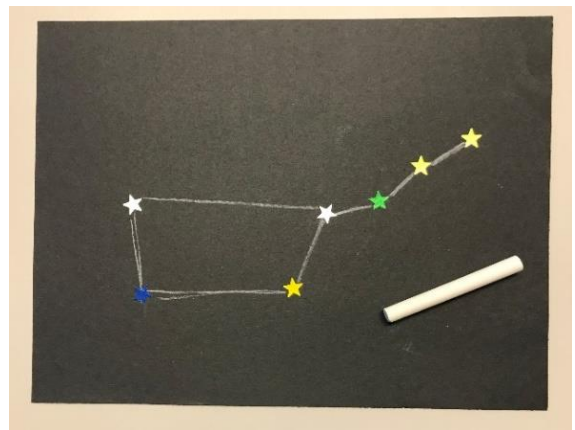
A constellation is a group of stars. The groups are identified by patterns that people have seen. Many have been named after familiar animals, everyday objects, and characters from stories. Your child can make up their own constellations using star stickers and chalk. Peeling and sticking the stickers on the paper uses fine motor skills that are good for children to practice.

You'll need:

- Black or dark blue construction paper
- Star stickers
- Chalk or white crayon

What to do:

1. Place the star stickers on the paper. If you don't have stickers, you can draw stars or dots on the paper with the chalk or crayon.
2. Connect the stars with the chalk or crayon to make a constellation. Be sure to give your constellation a name!
